Enrol your cat in this study and receive a behaviour profile.

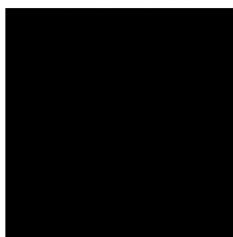
