


Supplementary Figure S1. Correlation between aneuploidy (tetraploid and multiploid CTCs) and the clinical prognosis. Overall Survival and one-year survival are irrelevant to the number of tetraploid and multiploid CTCs. CTCs: circulating tumor cells.
