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

Glio14 exhibit dose-dependent loss of viability when treated with chloroquine, an effect potentiated by treatment with radiation, while Glio9 exhibited moderately decreased cell viability with combination therapy. Viability of Glio11, the only GSC line without increased autophagosome formation, is not affected by radiation plus chloroquine. Results are representative of at least three experiments and displayed as mean \pm SEM.

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
