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Message from the Guest Editor

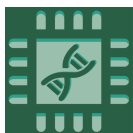
Dear Colleagues,

This Special Issue of Biosensors will be focusing on 3D printing for biosensing. The understanding of the term “3D printing” shall be the use of a 3D printer, commercially available or homemade, or a 3D printing process enabling the additive fabrication of objects in the centimeter range. The printed system shall also exhibit active functions, such as microfluidic and/or signal transduction, but also biosensing element, printed or not using a 3D printing technique. Manuscripts dedicated to tissue engineering, but with an application in diagnostic or biosensing, are also welcome.

Interesting approaches using the 3D printing of biochips are also warmly welcome since this is a very hot topic in the field of functional devices prototyping and production.
