- Bioactive natural compounds from diverse sources, including plants, animals, microbes, and marine organisms, against various cancers: Computational, preclinical, and clinical studies;
- Mechanism-based anticancer activity of natural compounds (botanical drugs, uncharacterized plant extracts, and fractions are excluded);
- Nanoformulations for site-targeted anticancer drug delivery;
- Cheminformatics and bioinformatics integrating genomic data and computational modeling;
- Role of translational informatics in natural-productbased anticancer drug discovery.

Note:

- Manuscripts describing the effects of botanical or natural drugs/extracts/fractions will not be considered;
- The active ingredients or constituents of the natural agents should be determined or presented;
- The toxicity of the natural compounds should be evaluated in both in vitro and in vivo studies.
