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Contemporary Approaches to Autism: Where Are We Now—a Cross-National Perspective

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Increased prevalence of Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) has been observed in the past few decades, estimated at 1.85% (1 in 54) children in the U.S. (Maenner et al., 2020) according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). In 2021, the World Health Organization cited that about one in 160 children has an ASD (Mayada et al., 2012).

Around 50% of individuals with ASD have anxiety that affects their daily lives (Davis Iii et al., 2017), and updated research is needed to inform practices in education and early intervention.

This Special Issue of *Education Sciences* aims to reflect contemporary research trends in the field of intervention for autism. Potential topics include the following: current educational, familial, and clinical aspects of autism; corelated issues such as anxiety; professional areas of enquiry such as early intervention, teaching, and contemporary knowledge of intervention and prevention approaches, among others.
