Message from the Guest Editor

Spatiotemporal mismatch in the resolution/scale and misalignment of environment and health data sets has been a major challenge for conducting epidemiological analyses of the health effects of environment. Because resolving spatiotemporal misalignment and resolution of these data sets often result in “exposure uncertainty” and/or “exposure misclassification”, failing to account for such exposure uncertainty and misclassification can result in biased (health) risk estimates. Therefore, addressing environmental exposure uncertainty and misclassification to quantify environmental disease burden is critically important for guiding policies to protect public health from environmental insults. This Special Issue invites scholarly work to address methodological, as well as application areas of spatiotemporal modeling of the health effects of environmental exposure or novel approaches for capturing and quantifying precise exposure.
