Dear Colleagues,

Prostate cancer (PCa) is the second most common cancer in men. The latest statistics have shown that one in six men will be diagnosed with PCa during their lifetime. PCa treatment depends on the tumor's stage, the patient's age and overall health, and tumor risk assessment. For non-metastasized PCa, radical prostatectomy or radiotherapy is the treatment of choice with curative intent. However, due to PCa's high dependency on androgen receptor (AR) signaling, the gold standard for metastasized PCa treatment was dominated by androgen deprivation therapy (ADT) for a long time. However, recent advances have led to a change in the treatment landscape, and combination therapies and new treatment regimens are now approved to treat metastatic PCa. This Special Issue aims to discuss and reflect on all recent advances in basic, translational, and clinical prostate cancer research. Therefore, manuscripts investigating new therapeutic strategies, prognostic as well as diagnostic biomarkers, and resistant mechanisms to the new regimen are of special interest.
