Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) is a leading cause of morbidity and mortality worldwide. COPD is complex and heterogeneous with respect to its aetiology, clinical presentation, phenotypes, and biological mechanisms. There is an urgent need to identify COPD patients at high risk for poor outcomes and to understand at a mechanistic level why certain individuals are at high risk. Treating COPD patients according to their unique pathophysiological abnormalities and identifying high-risk individuals will become much easier with the availability of larger data sets, more omics, and new analytical techniques. This Special Issue will address precision medicine approaches, which focus on understanding an individual's disease risk, and tailoring management based on pathobiology, environmental exposures, and psychosocial issues. Therefore, to move this field forward, we invite original research, perspectives, and state-of-the-art reviews on clinical advances in COPD.
