Microbial enzymes play an integral and important role in a number of different biotechnological applications. Microbial enzymes and, especially, biocatalysis have developed enormously in the last decade and now offer solutions for the sustainable production of chiral and highly functionalized molecules. Recent advances in oxidative enzymes have furthermore boosted research towards biorefineries and biofuels. This enormous progress is based on new approaches for the screening and identification of novel microbial enzymes, various methods to efficiently (over)produce enzymes in an economic way, various techniques to tailor enzymes with respect to desired or novel properties, as well as a wealth of structural data on enzymes.
