Message from the Guest Editors

Religions and geopolitics have conjoined and moved to the center stage of today's dangerous world. They are strange association bedfellows: with Nazism discredited geopolitics, whereas religion which gave birth to the International Relations (IR) discipline through the bloody intra-Christian wars of the 16th and 17th centuries has been excluded from the public sphere and international relations. Now the two return "from exile" in many narratives. The concept of Eurasia, in combination with the "holy" mission of Russian Orthodox Christianity to save it from the "decadent" Western branch, the West, attracts anti-Western geopolitical alliances such as BRICS of explicitly mutually hostile religious faiths.

To include all narratives into the new "Global IR" trend, we want to explore the range of narratives of geopolitics and religion, as they come from different parts of the world but are often not included as mere ideologies filtered out of the Western dialogue.

We are pleased to invite contributions beyond the view of religion as merely a "soft power" to "sharp" or "smart", towards a new generation of critical geopolitics of religions.
