Fragment of play fight sequence between piglets. Hopping (a play signal) is performed by the individual with only one black patch on the back.

### Video\_S3

Fragment of real fight sequence between wild boar hybrids. No play signals are present whereas attempt bites are present. One of the two individual flees.
