In the era of the Anthropocene, pathogens in wildlife are not only an important conservation issue threatening mainly sylvatic populations; they also seem to increasingly thrive at the wildlife–livestock–human continuum. Climate change and human-caused defragmentation of the habitat not only facilitate the surge of emerging diseases but also increase the occurrence of endemic pathogens to a determined area. This Special Issue will cover epidemiology, molecular biology, therapy, host–pathogen interactions, genomics, and clinical cases of any bacteria and/or parasite species occurring in wildlife, including captive and semi-captive species. Of particular interest are zoonoses, spill-over events, pathogens occurring under the One Health umbrella, as well as diseases affecting threatened and nearly threatened species. Further, this Special Issue covers the epidemiology of wildlife, especially under the influence of climate, humans, and invasive species.
