This Special Issue covers the "Mineralogy and Genesis of Precious, Rare and Critical Metals in Ore Deposits of Greece" and will include a wide range of topics related to the geology, tectonics, petrology, geochemistry, and mineralogy of these hydrothermal deposits. Greece has historically been a major producer of metals, starting as far back in antiquity as 5000 years ago when the famous Lavrion district was mined for silver. Since that time, a large number of ore deposits and commodities have been discovered, which are critical to the development of Greece and the European Union. These deposits include hydrothermal and/or magmatic-hydrothermal epithermaland porphyry-type deposits and the reduced intrusion related systems of the Serbomacedonian and the Rhodope metallogenic provinces in Northeastern Greece, which contain Sb, Te, Mo, Re, Ga, In, REE and PGE; and precious metal carbonate replacement metal deposits of Lavrion and the Kassandra mining district.
