Most cSCCs are treated successfully by surgical excision and have a good prognosis, but about 10% of these cancers show a more aggressive behavior. These cases of locally advanced and metastatic cSCC are associated with a high mortality rate. They are not amenable to local surgery or radiotherapy and require systemic therapy.

In this Special Issue, we aim to compile papers addressing the importance of cSCC in public health regarding epidemiological aspects, prevention, and medical care. We are pleased to invite you to submit original research studies or reviews outlining future demands of cSCC management, which may also include your personal views and opinions.
