Prostate cancer is one of the most prevalent malignancies. While most cases are diagnosed at a localized stage, a considerable number of patients with intermediate or highrisk localized, locally advanced or metastatic cancer die from the disease each year. Although therapeutic advances have been introduced in the field of metastatic PC. androgen deprivation therapy remains the leading therapeutic backbone for metastatic PC. However, most patients develop castration resistance. The mechanisms driving the progression from androgendependent PC to castration-resistant prostate cancer are not completely understood. The treatment landscape of metastatic CRPC has substantially improved due to the availability of different agents. However, fast tumor progression, cross-resistance, the use of these substances in earlier stages of the disease, and patient-related factors should be taken into account when assessing which is the optimal treatment sequencing in the setting of mCRPC. This Issue aims, to better understand the biological mechanisms of tumor progression and, to elucidate recent clinical developments in the treatment of both localized and metastatic disease.
