I am pleased to welcome you to contribute to this Special Issue on therapy-related morbidity in childhood cancer survivors. The literature to this point has been largely crosssectional. although hypothesis-driven research. intervention-focused assessments, and the integration of genomics for prediction are becoming more commonplace. It is these latter areas that I would like to focus on as I believe they advance both our understanding of treatment-related late effects and improve our ability to risk stratify, treat, and manage childhood cancer survivors. Manuscripts should refer to key articles in the discipline, but then focus the discussion of the information gleaned from these historical references on how it is being used in current longitudinal studies, intervention-based trials, and basic and translational research.
