



Interventions Impacting the Natural History of Chronic Plaque Psoriasis

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Message from the Guest Editors

Chronic plaque psoriasis is not only a cutaneous disease, but a systemic disorder. There is a growing body of epidemiological evidence supporting the associations between psoriasis and cardiometabolic, gastrointestinal, renal, malignancies and mood disorders. The pathogenesis of the intersection of psoriasis and comorbidities is not fully understood. Identifying prognostic factors that negatively affect the clinical course of psoriasis may provide an important advantage, enabling early therapeutic intervention of patients at risk of worsening disease. The objective of the Special Issue is to collect evidence the impact of interventions on the natural history of plaque psoriasis. Experimental and observational studies, systematic reviews and meta-analyses and narrative reviews are welcome.
