The well-being of vulnerable children is essential for global equality; whether due to poverty, disability, poor access to education, experiences of maltreatment, or other life challenges threatening their expected development, the need to focus on the welfare and well-being of vulnerable children is a public health issue. Current knowledge concerning risk and protective factors of welfare and well-being differs depending on the vulnerability. However, similarities among knowledge suggest that contributing factors differentially occur at multiple levels, i.e., the child, family, community, and society. To promote the welfare and well-being of vulnerable children, a strong understanding of factors contributing to children's outcomes and how to address risk or promote resilience is required. Therefore, this Special Issue aims to address this problem by inviting research manuscripts addressing the welfare and well-being of vulnerable children, launching or adding to the evidence base.
