As with other forms of treatment, the basic goal of NR is to improve patients' functioning, decrease the severity of their impairing symptoms, and improve their quality of life. From a broader perspective, NR should be treated as an educative process that will make it easier for the disabled individual to cope with life's problems as independently as possible. This process requires active participation from the patient. Therefore, the recent consensus has been that NR is not performed on the disabled person, but that it is performed by them, with the help, guidance, and support of various professionals.

This Special Issue aims to discuss recent advances and changes in the field of neurological rehabilitation and their influence on the diagnosis and treatment of major neurological illnesses and disabilities, with particular emphasis on children and adolescents. We are interested in original research and review articles that may be helpful in further advancing current knowledge and practice in the field of NR.
