The main treatment for this pathology depends on its patomechanisms and the clinical condition. The present Special Issue is dedicated to the patomechanisms of decompensated heart failure and its treatment in patients with terminal heart failure, post-cardiosurgery cardiac failure, septic-shock-related cardiac decompensation, or traumatic brain injury-related cardiac decompensation. In this Special Issue, treatment with levosimendan and new β -blockers is also discussed.
