Message from the Guest Editors

Dear Colleagues,

Equity is a major goal for healthcare systems. Although significant efforts to reduce inequalities have been made by public authorities in many countries, barriers to accessing healthcare persist. Moreover, the Great Recession of 2008 forced many governments to implement significant public spending cuts and other reforms with likely negative impact on access to healthcare services. The current COVID-19 pandemic has posed additional challenges to healthcare systems and economies with adverse consequences on access to and use of healthcare services, particularly for vulnerable population groups: undocumented migrants, economically disadvantaged, ethnic minorities, people with mental health problems, etc. Equity in access and effective use of healthcare services is a multi-dimensional issue that may be analyzed from different perspectives—socio-economic, gender or geographic, among others—and with different methodologies. Papers addressing equity in healthcare from any relevant perspective are invited for this Special issue. We especially welcome contributions providing policy recommendations to improve equity goals.
