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Message from the Guest Editors

Currently, asthma is a disease that imposes a burden on patients, their families and the community, especially severe asthma. Patients with severe asthma experience a heavy burden of symptoms and exacerbations that require emergency care and may lead to death in some situations. In addition, patients with severe asthma face very high healthcare costs due to biologic treatment, physician visits, and hospitalizations. Therefore, many objectives in asthma management should be achieved in the near future for efficient control of this disease. More awareness on asthma adherence and asthma treatment in children and adults must be emphasized in patients' education programs. Advanced biomarkers of Th2- and non-Th2 asthma should be developed by scientists to drive the indication and follow-up of target treatment with biologic therapies in these patients. Finally, more research on asthma endotype and phenotype and its modifiable cofactors should be reconsidered by physicians in the next decade. Hence, this Special Issue of *Advances in Asthma* opens a new horizon in publication of relevant data and ideas on asthma research in 2020.
