### Message from the Guest Editors

This Special Issue of IJERPH, offers an opportunity to publish high-quality research, reviews, and theoretical notes that further the understanding of the means by which positive intergenerational ties are achieved and their impact on health and well-being. Submissions that discuss new knowledge, developments, and innovations working with diverse populations, in the field of health, and/or with consideration of implementation strategies, are particularly encouraged.

Abstracts (250 words) should describe theoretical underpinnings of the work and the methodological approach taken. Abstracts for empirical articles should describe the sample, methods and analytic approaches, and primary findings. For review articles, the abstract should include a discussion of criteria for inclusion. Authors reporting qualitative research should consider COREQ or SRQR reporting guidelines. The abstract should clearly reflect the goals of the special issue. Scholars from all career stages and backgrounds are encouraged to submit an abstract. Decisions on abstracts and invitations to submit full manuscripts will be sent to potential authors via email by September 15, 2022.
