Message from the Guest Editors

The effects on environmental and human health caused by anthropogenic impacts on the environment are increasingly visible. Among these impacts, sewage disposal and the disposal of solid waste still represent challenges to be overcome with the goal of sustainable development by 2030. Sewage treatment processes may represent a source of greenhouse gases, such as methane and nitrous oxide, but their management can favor the use of waste for energy generation, in addition to the use of water and nutrients. In this Special Issue, we hope to receive original manuscripts or revisions that refer to issues on the treatment of sewage with a view to the removal/degradation of emerging micropollutants, reuse, nutrient recovery and GHG emission, in addition to management in the prevention or reduction of pollution at the generating source. Articles showing data on monitoring these pollutants as well as the treatment of leaching combined or not with sewage are also of interest to us. Finally, studies on the monitoring of water systems regarding the occurrence of impacts caused by classical pollutants as well as emerging ones will also be welcome.
