This is referred to as hormesis. In this Special Issue, we overview some representative phenomena of hormesis, nature of stress that enables for hormesis, molecular definition (signature) on which hormesis is activated, experimental models representing hormesis, and would focus on the underlying mechanisms of the counter-intuitive hypothesis, the "Hormesis Neo-Biology".
