Message from the Guest Editors

Dear Colleagues,

This special issue deals with a native gastric peptide, resistant and stable in the human gastric juice, membrane stabilizer, counteracting gut-leaky syndrome, the stable gastric pentadecapeptide BPC 157, as a particular target, distinctive from the standard peptide growth factors, with particular molecular pathways involved, controlling VEGFand NO-pathways. As novel mediator, BPC 157 was coming after the evidenced point of their limited beneficial effects. and NO-system importance widely introduced, but established interconnection vigorously with systems (i.e., prostaglandins, dopamine, important serotonin, NO). In addition to the beneficial effect on the entire gastrointestinal tract, and other organs various agents- and/or noxious procedures-induced lesions (liver. lung, heart, spinal cord and brain), and considerable wound healing, it may include counteraction of the depression-models, schizophrenia positive symptommodels and catalepsy-models. Recently, counteracts the vascular occlusion disturbances and blood pressure disturbances (relieving a Virchow's triad situation) by rapid activation of the collateral vessel pathways.
