Humans are exposed to a myriad of environmental chemicals every day. These include polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons, metals, volatile organics, pesticides, and industrial chemicals, PM 2.5, etc. Environmental exposures during pregnancy can lead to abnormal pregnancy and neonatal outcomes such as bronchopulmonary dysplasia and cognitive and neurodegenerative deficits. However, the molecular mechanisms underlying these effects are not well understood.
