



Management, Pathogenesis, and Treatment of Rhinosinusitis

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Message from the Guest Editor

Dear Colleagues,

Rhinosinusitis is a very common condition, presenting with different clinical phenotypes and molecular endotypes. Pathogenesis is not fully understood, and neither is the interplay between nasosinus inflammation and systemic comorbidities, including lower airway disease. In recent decades, bacterial biofilm and impairments in respiratory microbioma have been considered to be among pathogenic factors. The effectiveness of conventional (medical or surgical) treatment is not completely predictable, and personalised treatment focusing on biological, anatomic, and microbiological characterization could be more effective.

For an upcoming Special Issue in the *Journal of Clinical Medicine* (PubMed indexed), we invite authors to contribute articles focusing on the diagnosis, treatment, and pathogenesis of rhinosinusitis in both adult and pediatric patients.





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
