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Message from the Guest Editors

Perioperative care includes every stage of a patient's journey from when they are identified for an operation to when they are discharged from the hospital. Each procedure carries its specific set of management issues and potential complications and has its own unique needs in preoperative preparation. In addition to the risks of surgery and anesthesia, each patient presents with their own characteristics, risk factors, and comorbidities. Morbidity and perioperative mortality related to surgery involve these multiple factors. Risk stratification tools can be used to better determine the risk of complications and mortality in the surgical context, allowing for the identification of patients requiring a different preoperative evaluation, and may help guide better postoperative care. In this Special Issue, we welcome authors to submit papers on the perioperative care surgical patients. We are willing to cover preoperative care and the preparation of the patient for surgery and to discuss the recognition of the risk of complications associated with perioperative care and with different outcomes.
