Message from the Guest Editors

This last decade has seen major advances in the management of pre-hospital patients. One example is electrocardiogram-based telemedicine as a cornerstone in pre-hospital triage; other efforts have also been made for triaging patients early in the pre-hospital setting in order to expedite triage, diagnosis and treatment. Future research should focus on possibilities for enhancing early diagnosis and treatment of these patients to improve outcomes. Furthermore, device therapies such as transcatheter aortic valve replacement and mitral clip emerged nearly 20 years ago and changed the landscape of structural heart intervention cardiology. These procedures have rapidly transitioned from an innovative procedure to standard of care. Trends in the utilization of percutaneous devices in the cath-lab took off, starting from one man just a few decades ago to exponential usage.
