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Message from the Guest Editor

Dear Colleagues,

Improvements in the prevention of common cardiovascular risk factors and promotion of a healthy lifestyle has reduced the burden of cardiac diseases in developed countries; however, civilization-induced cardiac diseases are booming in the developing countries. Furthermore, cardiology does not concentrate only on common cardiac diseases, such as hypertension, dyslipidemia, or coronary artery disease. Novel diagnostic imaging modalities are being constantly developed alongside with spectacular advances in laboratory diagnostics, including biomarker studies and molecular medicine. Some unexpected results of those trials call for substantial changes in the daily management of patients. It is becoming clear that the “one size fits all” approach should no longer be a standard of care. On the contrary, a personalised (tailored) approach, based on diagnostics and therapeutic advances, should be the centre of decision-making process.

We encourage the submission of original articles and reviews which describe a personalized medicine approach to the diagnosis and therapies to cardiac diseases.
