In particular, we seek articles drawing upon case studies that provoke or allow for reflection on and/or reappraisals of 1) the nature of “Hindu” and “Christian” identity; 2) the character of Hindu–Christian interactions; 3) the historical or contemporary politics of Hindu–Christian relating; 4) the appropriateness of comparison, comparative religion, or comparative theological categories; 5) the state of “Hindu–Christian Studies”, and/or the suitability of regnant terms, concepts, and comparisons in the field; 7) the role of gender, race, caste, and/or sexuality in Hindu–Christian encounters; 8) the potential of Hindu–Christian dialogue; and 9) dual or hybrid identities, multiple belonging, and shared practices.
