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Message from the Guest Editors

Consumers' attitudes, knowledge, concerns, beliefs, emotions and preferences are of critical importance for achieving significant reductions in material consumption, effective penetration of green(er) technological innovations, sustainability-oriented adjustments in the production chain and also for developing policy schemes to coordinate action towards these goals.
